Our theory of change is that awareness is the starting point for meaningful advocacy, engagement and change. We are on a journey to raising awareness of the state and trend of infrastructure in Africa, empowering people and communities with the right information to take local actions that will drive change and sustainable development. Our mission is to bridge the infrastructure knowledge gap by being the one-stop hub for accurate, reliable and up-to-date information on infrastructure issues and trends in Africa. InfraSpotlight is building the capacity of citizens, communities, development actors and key stakeholders in evidence-based advocacy, policy making and planning across the continent by increasing their knowledge of infrastructure development.

Our mission is to be the one-stop hub for accurate, reliable and up-to-date information on infrastructure development in Africa. We aim to build the capacity of Africans on evidence-based advocacy across the continent by increasing the knowledge of citizens on infrastructure development.



2025 Highlights & Key Milestones

I - Projects

SeraNova - History was made on **31 January 2025** with the launch of Africa's first bespoke platform for infrastructure-related policies. After nine (9) months of dedication, innovation and collaboration, SeraNova officially went live. SeraNova is Africa's pioneering digital repository for infrastructure policies across the continent. Derived from the Swahili word séra, meaning "policy", SeraNova serves as a gateway to Africa's infrastructure policy landscape. Developed to bridge the continent's infrastructure knowledge gap, SeraNova provides a streamlined search tool that grants users access to the latest infrastructure policies from 28 African countries. From concise policy snapshots to in-depth analyses and expert commentaries, SeraNova harnesses technology to empower decision-makers, researchers and stakeholders with the insights needed to drive sustainable growth and make informed decisions.

5 Country Policy Tracking & Reporting Completed

- Ahead of the 2025 national elections, InfraSpotlight conducted a monitoring exercise in five countries: Burundi, Gabon, Namibia, Seychelles and Tanzania focusing on policies set to conclude in 2025. The exercise aimed to track the progress of policy implementation and assess how effectively these policies were being executed.

CSG Project - This research project was undertaken by InfraSpotlight in collaboration with CSG Development Ltd, examining access to essential infrastructure services and social protection in Nigeria. The study explored how households experience and access primary healthcare, energy and clean water, with the aim of identifying gaps and highlighting opportunities for private sector investment to enhance these critical amenities. The project was launched on 26 May 2025 and concluded on 22 August 2025.

II - Programmes

January – Virtual Stakeholder Dialogue

On **24 January 2025**, InfraSpotlight hosted its first stakeholder dialogue, themed “Mainstreaming Infrastructure Development in National Development Plans and Policymaking”, ahead of the launch of its digital policy repository, SeraNova. The dialogue brought together key stakeholders from the development sector and policy advocacy space to explore pathways for effectively positioning infrastructure development within national development plans.



The event featured a keynote address by **Dr Tayo Aduloju**, CEO of the Nigerian Economic Summit Group (NESG), followed by a panel session with distinguished thought leaders: **Abiola Durodola**, Founder of Advokc; **Dolapo Agbede**, Diversity, Equity and Inclusion (DEI) Expert; and **Victoria Oladipo**, Founder of Learn Politics, who moderated the session.

A total of 54 participants attended the event and received an exclusive preview of SeraNova ahead of its official launch on 31 January 2025.

March Workshop – Building Resilient Infrastructure: Mitigating the Impact of Climate-related Hazards



On **21 March 2025**, InfraSpotlight held a workshop that brought together key stakeholders and enthusiasts in climate advocacy, disaster management and infrastructure development to explore strategies for building resilient infrastructure and strengthening disaster preparedness at both national and local levels.

Attended by 24 participants, the workshop examined the critical role of resilient infrastructure in mitigating the impacts of climate-related hazards across Africa. Speakers **Taiwo Ogunwumi**, Founder of the Geohazard Risk Mapping Initiative, and **Dr Bobuchi Ken-Oporum**, Creator of the Re-HOUSED Multi-criteria Decision

Support Toolkit, led thought-provoking sessions supported by interactive discussions and breakout-room activities.

July Workshop – Implementing AfCFTA: Infrastructure as a Catalyst for Seamless Intra-African Trade



In partnership with AfCFTA Dialogues, InfraSpotlight held a workshop on 26 July 2025 that explored how infrastructure can serve as a catalyst for seamless intra-African trade. The session focused on practical tools, real-world case studies and strategies designed to empower stakeholders particularly MSMEs to engage meaningfully with the opportunities presented by the AfCFTA.

Speakers including **Nozipho Hlophe**, Regional Trade Analyst at UNDP Africa, and **Ijidolapo Ijiwoye**, Founder of Trade Flow Africa, shared insights on the importance of private sector-driven integration and offered guidance on how MSMEs and business

owners can navigate barriers to trade.

It was a proud moment for InfraSpotlight, with 26 attendees representing 11 African countries and beyond.

November Workshop – Strengthening Public Accountability and Civic Engagement in Infrastructure Projects in Nigeria



Our final workshop of the year was held on **22 November 2025**, with 18 participants in attendance. The workshop equipped participants with an understanding of how public sector inefficiencies affect infrastructure development, and provided practical tools and methods for improving transparency, monitoring projects and holding government agencies accountable.

The session featured a keynote address by **Mr Joseph Aniekan**, Public Policy Enthusiast, followed by practical sessions led by thought leaders including

Ebenezer Wikina, Founder of Policy Shapers and Visionary of Rivers2050; **Oluwabusola Fadipe**, Founder of InfraSpotlight; **Victoria Oladipo**, Founder of Learn Politics; and Obinna Gabriel, Community Organiser and SPPG Alumnus.

Online Conversations



In addition to workshops, InfraSpotlight hosted a series of online conversations to explore key topics in a more informal and engaging way, encouraging open dialogue.

7 March 2025 – International Women's Day Conversation

To commemorate International Women's Day, InfraSpotlight held an online conversation on Instagram titled "Accelerating Infrastructure for Women's Economic Empowerment and Livelihoods." The guest speaker, **Tolulope Babajide**, Regional Gender and Inclusion Expert, shared insights on how gender-responsive infrastructure development can contribute to more inclusive and sustainable communities.



27 June 2025 – World MSME Day Conversation

To mark World MSME Day, we hosted an online conversation featuring **Yemisi Isidi**, Co-Founder at Triift Africa, on the topic "Infrastructure as a Lifeline for MSME Success in Africa." The discussion examined the crucial role of infrastructure from road networks to digital connectivity in determining how micro, small and medium-sized enterprises grow, access markets and scale.



27 September 2025 – Conversation on Misinformation and Infrastructure

Misinformation has become a silent threat undermining Nigeria's infrastructure development. From exaggerated government claims to propaganda that distorts on-the-ground realities, false narratives erode public trust and hinder progress. InfraSpotlight held an online conversation on X (formerly Twitter) titled "Misinformation and its Impact on Infrastructure Development in Nigeria." The guest speaker, **Bakare Majeed**, Journalist and Political Economist, explored how misinformation shapes public perception and influences infrastructure policy in Nigeria.

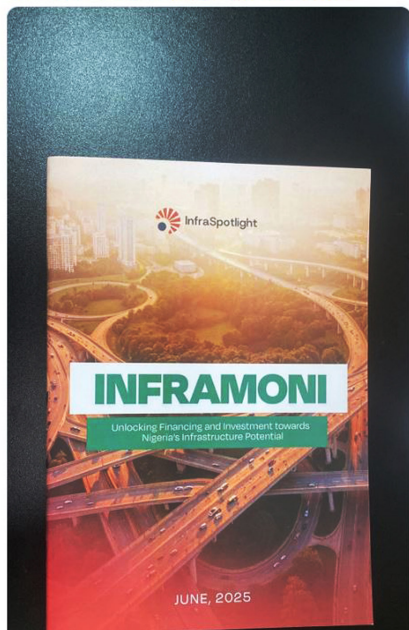

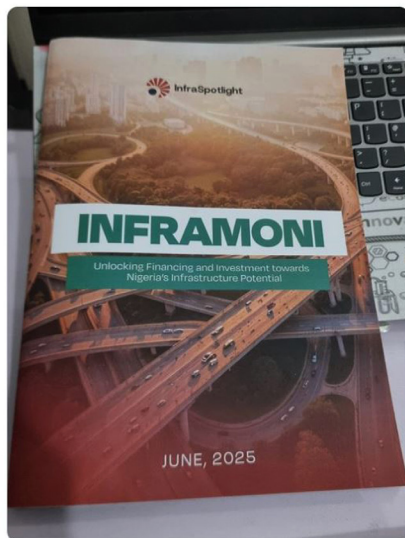

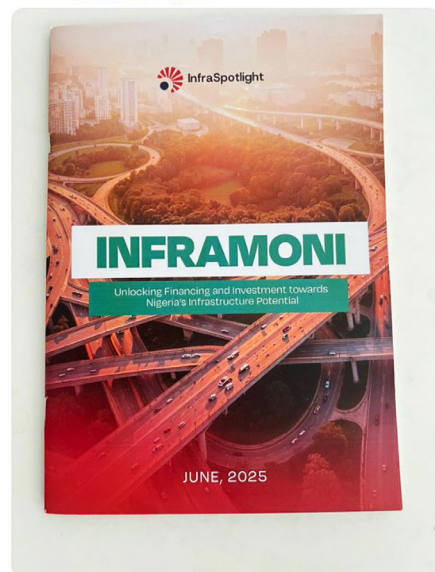

InfraLingo – In February, we launched InfraLingo, a weekly educational series designed to simplify infrastructure concepts and terminologies every Friday. The first season ran from 7 to 28 February 2025 and featured the following concepts: BRT, Urban Planning, Infrastructure Master Plan and Green Infrastructure.

Following a successful first season, InfraLingo returned in August 2025 for its second season, running every Friday throughout the month. This season covered terminologies such as Corridor Planning, Build–Operate–Transfer (BOT), Build–Operate–Own (BOO) and the Trans-African Highway Network (TAH).

Explainer Videos – As part of our mission to raise awareness and strengthen advocacy for infrastructure development, we produced short explainer videos spotlighting critical issues related to infrastructure policies, projects and public spending in Nigeria and across Africa. The aim was to draw attention to these issues and stimulate increased civic engagement.

Financial Overview

In 2025, InfraSpotlight conducted its first donation drive to mark the organisation's first anniversary on 20 May. The drive aimed to scale our impact by raising funds to enhance existing tools and resources, enabling us to continue serving the public effectively.

Between October and December 2025, InfraSpotlight launched its inaugural Impact Partners Network, designed to engage individuals and organisations committed to strengthening infrastructure for sustainable development. Another prominent post analysed the strengths and weaknesses of the President's infrastructure plan, unveiled on 1 September. With over 1,000 views, the post effectively engaged viewers by breaking down complex policy initiatives into clear insights, encouraging discussion around the plan's potential impact and areas for improvement.

2026 - Looking Ahead

In 2026, InfraSpotlight aims to scale its impact across its key pillars: publications, projects and programmes.

Launch of the Citizen Handbook – January 2026

The Handbook will provide practical knowledge and tools to help citizens understand how infrastructure is planned and delivered, track projects in their communities, and demand transparency, accountability and inclusive development from government institutions.

Launch of InfraMoni 2026 – June 2026

The next edition of InfraMoni, titled “Strengthening Transparency and Governance in Infrastructure Financing in Nigeria”, will continue our mission of monitoring and reporting on infrastructure financing in the country. This edition will assess current transparency mechanisms, identify gaps and provide recommendations for reforms to improve accountability and efficiency in infrastructure funding.

SeraNova Expansion

In 2026, SeraNova will grow to cover seven (7) additional African countries, further expanding access to infrastructure policies and enabling decision-makers, researchers and stakeholders to make informed choices across the continent.

Ahead of the 2027 Elections

InfraSpotlight will track Presidential and State election candidates’ manifestos as part of a digital campaign aimed at ensuring infrastructure receives the attention it deserves. This initiative will encourage citizens to evaluate candidates’ infrastructure plans in their voting decisions and will form the basis for post-election accountability on nationwide infrastructure commitments.
